

Journey with Jesse

Friends in Christ,

Since the 4th century, Christians have prepared for Easter with a season of spiritual examination and repentance. Lent has been observed as a solemn season in the liturgical calendar that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends approximately six weeks later, before Easter Sunday.

The purpose of Lent has normally been preparing Christians spiritually for Easter through prayer, repentance, almsgiving, and austerity. It often includes the willingness to take on some spiritual discipline, whether it's fasting or increased time for prayer or Scripture or acts of service and mercy.

While I get the importance of a time for spiritual self-examination, I've never resonated much with the solemnity and self-denial of the Lenten season. I've tended to see this whole time period as an opportunity to intentionally practice simplicity so as to open the doors for greater awakening and attuning to God's presence in our lives.

This Lent, we might take some time to ask ourselves reflective questions like: What does it mean for me to live a time of Lenten simplicity and awakening? What does it mean for me embark on God's path of living the good news of Jesus Christ?

As we journey into and through Lent together as a church, there are a few oportunities to get connected and reflect on our faith:

- 1) Open and Affirming Sermon Series: One of my pastoral goals for 2021 is to lead us in becoming more "out front" and expressive of our ONA identity. To support this, and as part of our Lenten journey, throughout February I'm leading a sermon series focused on exploring what ONA is and why it's so important in our life of faith.
- *2) Ash Wednesday Service:* Our Ash Wednesday Service will be held live-streaming on YouTube this year, just like our weekly Sunday services. Since we're not meeting in person, obviously there will be no imposition of ashes during the service. However, if you would like a blessing and an ashes sticker from me, please come to Drive-Through Ashes behind the church on Wednesday, February 17th @ 11:00am 12:00pm & 4:00pm 5:00pm.

3) Lenten Class: I will also lead an online class during Lent called *Unlikely Gifts: Exploring the Spiritual Benefits of Our Difficulties*. Join me as we take a look at some of the more difficult emotions that come up in life, especially these days, and explore how they might be "unlikely gifts" that can open us up to new experiences of God and life. We will be via Zoom on Wednesdays throughout Lent, starting February 24th and going through March 24th at 7:15pm.

As we move forward into Lent 2021, may we continue to look to Jesus Christ as the head of the church, guiding and shaping us into greater awakening and attuning to God's Spirit within us and among us.

- The vaccine will help protect you and others around you, like friends and family.

What can I expect from the COVID-19 vaccine?

- You will need 2 doses, approximately 3 weeks apart, to get the full protection from the vaccine.
- You may experience some side effects, like tiredness, headache, and muscle pain--but this is a sign that the vaccine is doing its job. Your immune system has kicked in. These side effects do not last long.
